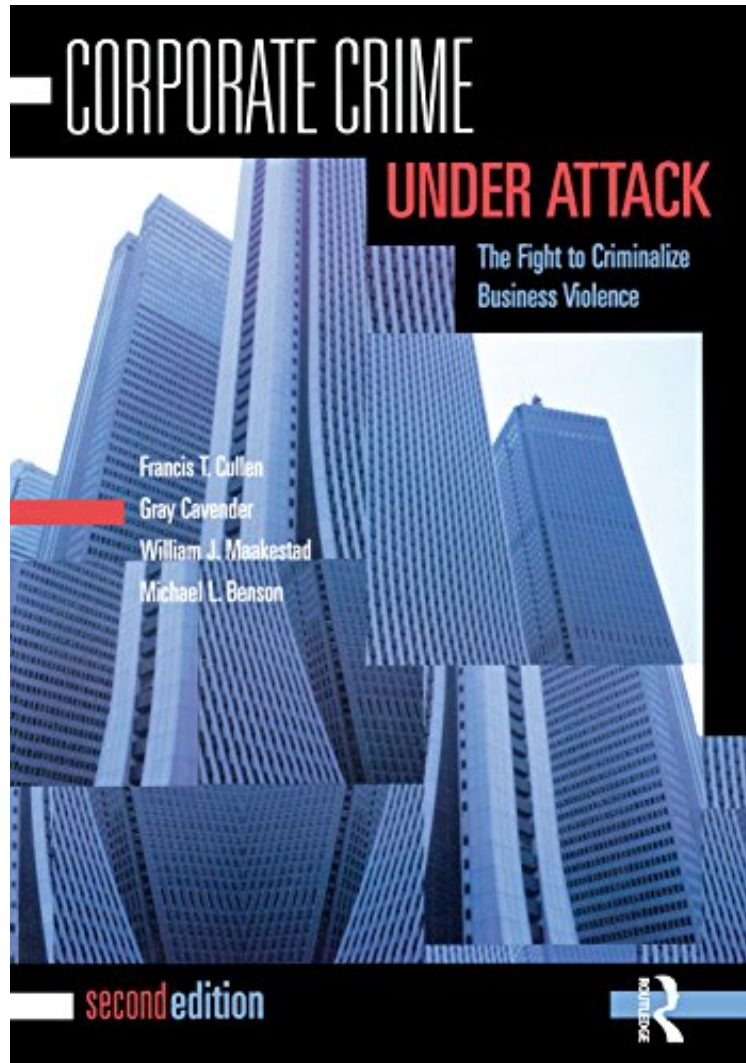

one, and it adds a few features that are not commonly found in similar texts. Culet et. al includes a history of the evolution of the corporation that helps to explain why corporate crime is so complicated. While many texts simplify the battle against corporate crime, Cullen et. al adds more than the usual amount of depth with its discussion of the role of media in the battle against corporate crime. While some texts bemoan the lack of impact that anticrime movements have had, Cullen et. al is not so pessimistic. For these, and many other reasons, this is a valuable book. A SPECIAL WORD TO SOCIOLOGY AND CRIMINOLOGY STUDENTS: Notice what I wrote about the unique features of this book and notice that it currently must be purchased used. In exploring the criminalization of corporations, this book uses the landmark "Ford Pinto case" as a centerpiece for exploring corporate violence and the long effort to bring such harm within the reach of the criminal law. Corporations that illegally endanger human life now must negotiate the surveillance of government regulators and risk civil suits from injured parties seeking financial compensation. They also may be charged with criminal offenses and their officials sent to prison.
