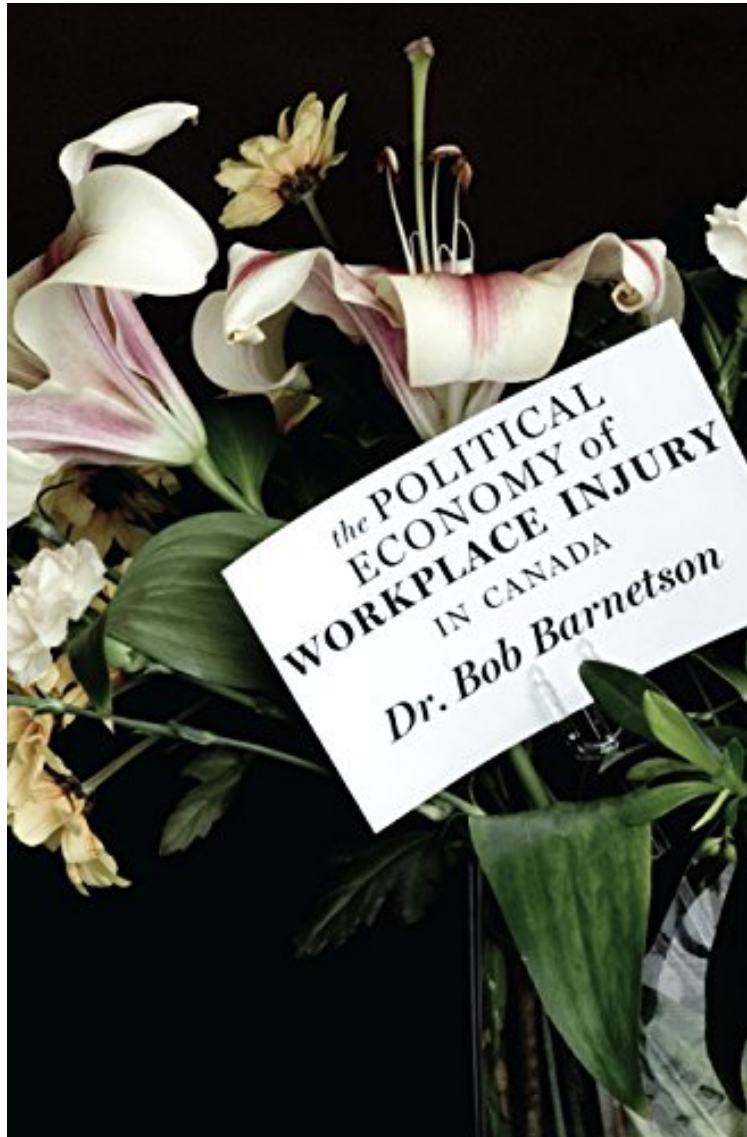


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## Political Economy of Workplace Injury in Canada (Fabriks: Studies in the Working Class)
